

CEGA REGIONAL GRADUATE STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

Description:

There will be four (4) awards in the amount of **\$2500** each which will be awarded across Canada with three MSc. awards defined by regions and a Ph.D award not defined by region. The three MSc. regions are defined as follows:

1. Atlantic and Quebec Universities
2. Ontario Universities
3. Western Universities

If there are a lack of applicants from one or more regions the distribution of the awards may be adjusted by the committee.

Purpose:

To provide financial support for Geology or Earth Science graduate students (MSc. or PhD candidates) who are pursuing a thesis-based degree with a dissertation in the field of Earth Sciences having application to the energy industry.

Eligibility:

Candidates for this award must be:

- In the first year of their MSc. or PhD Geology or Earth Sciences degree program enrolled full-time at a Canadian university
- Disciplines include sedimentology, structural geology, stratigraphic studies involving clastic or carbonate rocks, paleontology, geochemistry, hydrogeology, petrophysics and reservoir geology as wells as emerging energy topics such as geothermal, carbon sequestration, hydrogen, helium and critical minerals.
- A student member of CEGA at the time of application – membership for students is free and can be done online at www.cegageos.ca
- Recipients are eligible to receive this award only once.

Application Details and Criteria:

- Candidates must fill in and submit the attached application form and a 400 – 600 word outline of their proposed thesis topic which should include:
 - An overview of the thesis including the goal(s), methodology of investigation, anticipated outcomes and results,
 - The importance and/or potential significance of the research to energy or sedimentary geology. Will your thesis affect the development of the energy resources of Canada and the world and/or improve the interpretation of sedimentary rocks?
 - What are the new or innovative concepts or techniques being developed in your thesis?
 - What are the practical aspects of your thesis? Might your work be useful for other future researchers or petroleum geologists?
- Candidates must be in good academic standing and include a letter from their supervising professor indicating their support and/or involvement in the thesis.
